MINUTES

Location: Bonney Lake Justice & Municipal Center, 9002 Main Street East, Bonney Lake, Washington.

I. CALL TO ORDER – Mayor Neil Johnson, Jr. called the Meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

A. Flag Salute: Mayor Johnson led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilmember Lewis moved to approve the Motion to ratify appointment of all the Commissioners. Councilmember Watson seconded the motion.

Motion approved 7 - 0.

Mayor Johnson said all of the Commissioners are doing a fabulous job and thanked them for their service. Deputy Mayor McKibbin asked whether

each Commissioner was contacted to confirm they would like to be reappointed. Mayor Johnson confirmed that had.

B. Citizen Comments:

III. COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A. Finance Committee: Deputy Mayor McKibbin said the Committee met today at 5:00 p.m. and heard a report from the Human Resources Manager, discussed the Fennel Creek Trail Project, and discussed funding for the emergency sewer issue.

B. Community Development Committee: Councilmember Lewis said the Committee met on March 21st and discussed the two items on the Consent Agenda, one item on tonight's Full Council issues, as well as the emergency resolution for an agreement with Tucci and Sons that was approved at the March 21st Council Workshop. He said the Committee also discussed the need for a possible second sewer line for an alternate means of transport for sewer, should the need arise.

D. Other Reports: Councilmember Watson said Lions Club will be hosting the annual Death by Chocolate event on April 8th, and tickets are now on sale. He stated that it is an excellent event for a very worthy cause.

VIII. FULL COUNCIL ISSUES:

- A. **AB17- 27 – Ordinance D17-27 –** An Ordinance Of The City Of Bonney Lake, Washington, Authorizing The Issuance And Sale Of Limited Tax General Obligation Bonds Of The City In An Aggregate Principal Amount Not To Exceed \$4,800,000 To Finance The Cost Of Certain Street Improvements In The City; Establishing Terms Of And Parameters For The Bonds; Authorizing Each Of The City Administrator And Finance Director To Act As The City's Designated Representative To Approve The Manner Of Sale And Final Terms Of The Bonds; Providing For The Disposition Of The Bond Proceeds; And Providing For The Annual Levy Of Taxes To Pay The Principal Of And Interest On The Bonds.

Councilmember Rackley moved to approve Ordinance 1573. Councilmember Watson seconded the motion.

Ordinance 1573 [D17-27] approved 7 - 0.

B. AB17-30 – Resolution 2585 – A Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Bonney Lake, Pierce County, Washington, Endorsing Sumner School District No. 320’s Proposal To Rename The School District As The Sumner-Bonney Lake School District.

Councilmember Watson moved to approve Resolution 2585. Councilmember Rackley seconded the motion.

Mayor Johnson said the City has waited for this proposal for some time. Councilmember Evans said he would like to keep the endorsement simple, without appearing to gloat. Councilmembers Rackley and Swatman agreed with removing the second and third “whereas” of the resolution.

Councilmember Rackley moved to amend the resolution to remove the second and third “whereas” statements. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion.

Motion to amend Resolution 2585 approved 7 - 0.


Councilmember Lewis said he supports the endorsement and thinks it’s a good idea to make it known that Bonney Lake schools are located within the Sumner School District.

Resolution 2585 approved as amended 7 – 0.


