**MAYOR JOHNSON AWARDED ADVANCED CERTIFICATE IN MUNICIPAL LEADERSHIP**

At the recent annual conference of the Association of Washington Cities, Mayor Neil Johnson was awarded an Advanced Certificate in Municipal Leadership. In order to achieve an Advanced Municipal Leader designation, an elected official is required to obtain an additional 30 credits of CML credit and demonstrate substantial community service in addition to their duties as an elected official. *Way to go Mayor Johnson!*

**TOWN TIDBITS**

- A Boy Scout working on his Eagle Project is building a map and a picture kiosk to be placed in the beach area of Allan Yorke Park; this kiosk will include historical maps and photos of the area around the park;
- A building permit has been issued for a \$750,000 remodel of the Target store to expand their grocery line.
- The City received an application for a restaurant named the Iron Dragon (similar to Mongolian Grill) which will be located at 19920 South Prairie Road.
- The City received an application for an addition and remodel of the existing McDonald's located at 21007 Hwy. 410 East.
- During the past month, the City Council has enacted a number of ordinances, including:

- Approved an amendment to the agreement with DM Disposal. This amendment allows DM to offer the full range of recycling services to commercial and multi-family customers.
- Authorized the City Administration to extend the acceptance of credit/debit card payments at the Annex for building and related permits.
- Amended BLMC 5.04 to clarify that both land-line and wireless communication service providers are subject to the same municipal utility tax.
- Approved an agreement with the Swiss Sportsmen's Club for the use of their firearms training facility by the Bonney Lake Police Department.

**CITY RECEIVES GOLD LEED CERTIFICATION FOR THE JUSTICE CENTER PROJECT**

The City of Bonney Lake has received confirmation from the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) that the new Justice Center building on Main Street has been awarded a LEED Gold Certification. Upon hearing of this achievement, Mayor Johnson said "We are very pleased to have achieved this level of certification for the Justice Center. The Justice Center building will serve as an example of how the Bonney Lake downtown can develop in a sustainable manner."

Leadership in Environmental Engineering and Design (LEED) is recognized in the United States and in a number of other countries around the world as the standard for measuring building sustainability. Achieving LEED certification is the best way one can demonstrate that a building project is truly "green." The LEED green building rating system is developed and administered by the U.S. Green Building Council, which is a nonprofit coalition of building industry leaders.



LEED certification involves a rigorous third-party commissioning process. The LEED rating system offers four certification levels for new construction - Certified, Silver, Gold and Platinum. The Gold certification is the second highest LEED certification available and few newly constructed buildings achieve a Gold rating.

The energy savings strategies alone built into the new building should reduce energy demand by 35% over a conventional office building. The end result is an attractive new municipal building for the community of Bonney Lake that will deliver reduced energy costs while enhancing comfort and productivity for occupants and visitors alike. ■

## BONNEY LAKE STREET CHIP SEALING TO BEGIN SOON

The City has issued a contract to chip seal several streets within the city limits. The work is due to begin around the end of July, weather permitting. Citizens who want to know the location of the various chip seal project streets can view the 2011 Chip Seal Map on the City's website. Look for the Current Projects/Chip Seal tab in the far left column of the home page.

When a firm schedule for the work is available, that information will also be added to the city web site page.

Why chip seal City streets? Chip sealing is a low cost action that increases the pavement life, provides better traction, and improves the appearance of the street while protecting the asphalt in the pavement from deterioration caused by ultraviolet rays. The oil placed on the road to hold the chips in place aids in sealing the cracks to prevent moisture from getting under the pavement which softens the road base and breaks up the pavement when the water expands due to freezing. This is the most common cause for potholes, and a chip sealing program helps reduce pot hole issues. ■
