They also participated in a victims training course. Community Court assisted a participant who was having issues getting formula for her baby. The case manager, Miss Lewis, was able to contact Great Roots NW to supply the family with formula.

		- 45,078 students and staff participated in the evacuation and shelter in place.

		Interim Public Services Director Sullivan presented the Code Enforcement Quarterly Report. Presented the uploaded monthly report. There are now 2 code enforcement officers. The team closed 49 cases during the quarter and opened 33 new cases. The team currently as 123 open cases

		Interim Public Services Director Sullivan presented Allan Yorke Park Operational Plan and Objectives. Discussed steps being taken to improve park and make residents feel comfortable and safe. Highlights are the vegetation management work being completed around AYP by the Park Crews to improve access, security, and visual appeal. The City's ability to take on this work was due to the fact that the Department has four staff members on the Park Crew and the need for this

level of staffing in the future. Other discussion items include the installation of the cameras at Field 5, the status of the paid parking, and modifications to the parking areas at the old Public Works/City Hall site to improve traffic flow.
